

History of Malta


The first inhabitants of Malta arrived about 5,200 BC from Sicily and began to farm the soil and build great temples.

About 800 BC the Phoenicians sailed to Malta. They gave Malta its name - Malet, meaning shelter or haven.

From about 400 BC the Carthaginians ruled Malta. After that, approximately 218 BC the Romans conquered it. Meanwhile about 60 AD. Paul was shipwrecked on Malta while being taken to Rome, as he was accused of being a political rebel and considered a potential threat to Roman rule. The ship carrying him, and 274 others was caught in a violent storm and wrecked on the Maltese coast. Paul converted Publius, the Roman ruler to Christianity. The rest of the Maltese population followed and soon became Christians. Nowadays, the site of the wreck is known as St. Paul's Island and is marked by a commemorative statue.

Later on, Malta was conquered by the Arabs, who influenced deeply the Maltese culture, especially the language. Arab rule was ended by the Normans, who captured Malta in 1090.

In 1283 Malta was captured by the Aragonese, so that it became part of the powerful Spanish Empire. Malta changed hands again in 1530. The Spanish king granted Malta to the Knights of St John. Initially, they went to Cyprus, but in 1310 moved to Rhodes in search of acquiring their own temporal domain. In 1523 the Turks captured Rhodes and the Knights were left without a home until the Spanish king gave them Malta to settle. At that time the Christians were fighting the Crusades against the Muslims. The Order of St John began to fight Muslims as well as care for sick pilgrims. Subsequently, their order was formally recognized by the Pope and they became the Knights of St John.



History of Malta

Their rule was ended by Napoleon Bonaparte, who conquered Malta in 1798. The Maltese rebelled against the French at Mdina and appealed to the British for help. From that moment Malta was recognized by the other European powers as a British colony. However, the British allowed the Maltese a limited role in government. Malta gained its independence in 1964 and from 1974 became a republic. Nowadays Malta is a flourishing country. Because of the abundance of historical places. monuments and venues, Malta is a popular filming destination. From 1925 to 2016, there have been at least 110 films that were either shot or set in Malta. Among them the most famous include: By the Sea, The Da Vinci Code, Alexander, Popeye, Clash of the titans, Troy, Gladiator, The Emperor's new clothes, The Count of Monte Cristo, Captain Philips, Midnight express and also the worldfamous TV series Game of Thrones.

In 2018 Valetta will be the European capital of culture and will host series of different events, exhibitions, performances and workshops in which an active role will have also the citizens of the islands. To give you a hint of the scheduled events and clearer idea of what to expect, some of them are e.g. – Picasso Exhibition held at Grand Master Palace in Valletta; The Valletta International Baroque Festival, Mozart's Don Giovanni, Exhibition: European Eyes on Japan,

Giuseppe Verdi's Aida, Education, Visual arts: Bodies in Urban Spaces and many others that could enrich both your imagination and personality.

Day 1 – Mdina Night Tour

Night visit to Mdina or "City of Silence", the ancient capital of Malta. We will get lost in the streets and alleys of the wonderful Mdina, surrounded by houses that belonged to the nobility of the time, convents and palaces of astonishing charm. We will discover different architectural styles in its buildings, such as the sixteenth-century Norman and the Baroque, by moonlight. We will pass the Malta Cathedral (from the outside) before reaching the fortifications which dominate the Maltese countryside and offer wonderful views over a large part of the island.







Day 1 - Dinner at Medina Restaurant (Option 1)

Medina Restaurant, Mdina

Hidden away in the enchantingly narrow streets of Mdina is this characterful 500 year old restaurant. Dine beneath a vaulted stone ceiling or in the internal courtyard.

Local ingredients underpin well-executed dishes which exhibit subtle modern twists. Just off Mdina's main Cathedral Square, in one of the Silent City's typical winding alleys, The Medina Restaurant is a jewel of an eatery, flooded with natural charm.

An original Norman residence, The Medina Restaurant is full of romanesque features, allowing for a truly unique dining ambiance.







Day 1 – Dinner at Grotto Tavern (Option 2)

The Grotto Tavern restaurant boasts typical Maltese house of character features and embraces a natural 2000-year-old cave. Day 2 - The 3 Cities

Discover the Grand Harbor area area opposite of Valletta, known under the name of "The Three Cities: Vittoriosa, Cospicua and Senglea", where the Knights of St John first settled in 1530.

Going past Cospicua you reach Vittoriosa for a walk through the alleys in the shadow of the historic buildings of the Order. On the Vittoriosa seafront we will take a typical harbor boat (dghajsa) for a tour of the colorful inlets of the port. From the Senglea Garden, located at the tip of the peninsula, enjoy a splendid 360 ° view of the Porto Grande, including the imposing Fort Sant Angelo from where Grand Master La Valette led the defense of the island during the Great Siege of 1565.







Day 2 - The 3 Cities and the Rolling Geeks

Take a seat in your rolling geek (electric car) in order to go up and down in these beautiful cities and discover more about their history.

Dghajsa Boat to Valletta

The luzzu is the foremost traditional fishing boat. It is pointed at both ends and is painted in characteristic brights colours. A variant, the kajjak, also a fishing boat, is similar in appearance, but has a square transom (back of the boat). Fregatina boats you can see during Freedom day race in the Grand Harbour.

These boats are painted in the traditional bright maritime colours: red, green and blue. Yellow and white could also be used. The colours are painted in stripes parallel to the waterline or to the curve of the upper border.



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Valletta The Fortress City

Valletta, The Fortress City, Città Umilissima, "a city built by gentlemen for gentlemen" is Malta's capital city. Valletta is named after its founder, the respected Grand Master of the Order of St. John, Jean Parisot de la Valette.

This visit includes St John Co-Cathedral where you can see the painting of 'The Beheading of St John the Baptist' by Caravaggio, the Grand Master's Palace (state rooms OR armory), and the Upper Barracca Gardens.







Day 2 - Food and Drink tour

Experience the street food of Valletta with a local tour guide, who will bring the tastiest treats of the island to your fingertips. Learn about Malta's history and cuisine during this experience. Meet your guide at the entrance of Valletta along the New Parliament Building. After a brief introduction to the city, start your food tour experience. Taste traditional dishes like pastizzi on the way. Walk past the main landmarks such as Republic Street, Castille Square, Merchants Street, Upper Barracca Gardens, the old market. See typical bars and side streets while savoring Maltese specialties, local antipasti, Kinnie, and lager.









Day 2 – Dinner at OKA's by the Villa (Optional)

OKA's at The Villa

OKA's at The Villa is located within the historic building of The Villa – an imposing 19th century palazzo, what used to be the summer residence of one of Malta's leading 20th century industrialists and one of the oldest structures in the Balluta area. OKA's was inspired by the famous oak trees overlooking Balluta Bay which symbolise strength, wisdom and endurance.







Day 3 - Full Day Gozo

After a short twenty-minute ferry crossing you will reach Mgarr harbour, which immediately sets the pace to Gozo's unique atmosphere. Your guide will lead you around the Megalithic temples of Ggantija, the oldest freestanding monuments in the world, predating the Pyramids of Egypt. This will be followed by visits to the medieval citadel in Victoria, the fjord-like bay at Xlendi and Dwejra. Gozo is well known for its crafts, particularly handmade lace and knitted garments. Visitors cannot fail to be impressed by the island's lush countryside, its serene atmosphere and how different it is from the larger island of Malta.


Day 3 - Wine Tasting in Gozo (Optional)


Wine tasting at Meridiana vineyard


